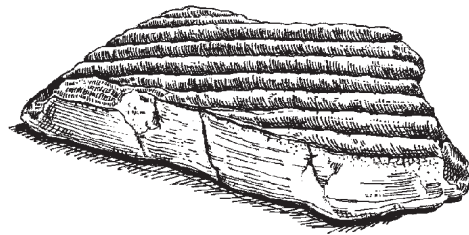

The Flinders Ranges are hot and dry now.

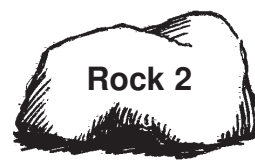

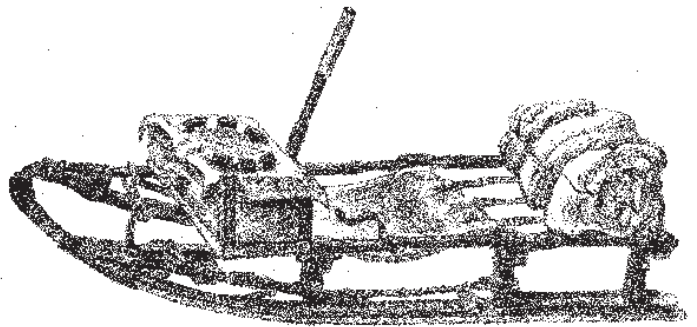
It was not easy exploring Antarctica. Find two photographs that show something that could have caused a problem for Mawson. For each photo write what the problem was.
